



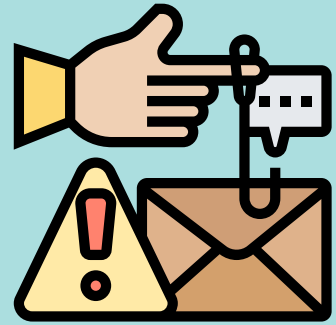
Job Scams Targeting Students



- 14 million people get tricked by job scams every year
- \$2 billion money loss every year
- individuals aged 18 to 24 are more likely to fall victim to a job scam



Fake Jobs on Social Media



- Comments about an "amazing opportunity, telling to message them directly or to click on a link.
- Direct messages with an "opportunity" for you to make tons of money working at home and only need your personal information or to click on a link.

Reshipping scams

- The Scammer will offer you an opportunity to work from home as a "reshipper", offering a fee for each package processed.
- The "job" will entail receiving packages at your address and then reshipping them as a whole, or breaking bulk and resending the packages.
- The goods you are shipping are generally stolen or bought online using stolen credit cards.



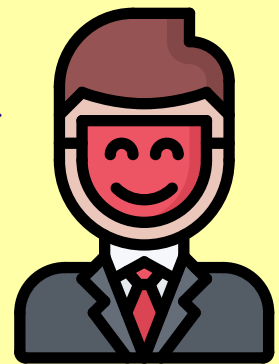
Money mule scams



- Transferring funds at someone else's direction, not knowing that they are laundering money
- The number of teenagers who are tricked into acting as money mules is rising - by 73% in the space of just two years

Career Consulting Scams

- Individuals telling you that you have an impressive resume and would like to help you find a job
- To ensure your success, you'll need to improve certain skills which means purchasing some of their products or services, including training sessions.



Phishing Scams



- When someone attempts to steal another person's sensitive information (i.e. credit card numbers, log-in information, social security number)
- Pretend to be part of a legitimate organization to trick you
